HCCF Awards \$777,775 in Community Support Grants

We're excited to share the first **\$777,775** in non-competitive grants from our new **\$3 million GIFT IX initiative, supported by Lilly Endowment Inc.** This initial funding will help address community issues you told us matter most in the 2025 Community Needs Assessment, like expanding transportation and increasing childcare options for local families. By partnering up with nonprofits across the county, we're ensuring these funds create a real, lasting difference for our neighbors.

GIFT IX Grant Recipients:

- **Hendricks County Senior Services:** Adding a new vehicle and staff to the LINK transportation system.
- **Hendricks Live!:** Continuing the "Opening Doors" series to bring diverse cultural programming to our community.
- **Susie's Place Child Advocacy Center:** Supporting a new Director of Development to ensure long-term sustainability.
- **The Republican Newspaper:** Delivering comprehensive voter guides to every household in the county.

Historic Gift Establishes Huron Family Fund at HCCF

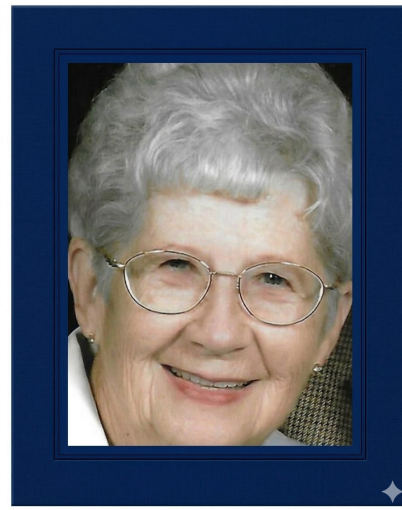
We're honored to share some historic news. HCCF has received a \$1.74 million bequest from the estate of Joyce Huron Hutchens Trent—the largest bequest in our history!

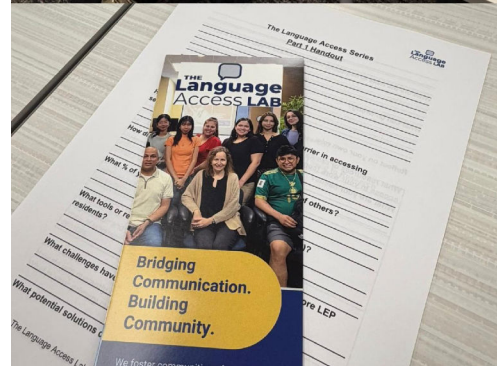
